**AGM Report** Thank you to everyone who came along to the AGM held this year for the first time at the Chichester City Arts Centre. The Financial Accounts for 2022/23 were approved and we welcomed Sarah Quail's return to the position of Chair, while Vince Waldron was re-elected as Treasurer and Bebette Jones as Secretary. Other Committee members re-elected were Julia Smith, Brian Raincock, Clare Heath while new members, Jeremy Havard and Des Evans were elected. Kathryn Kellagher has stood down from the Committee and was thanked for the many years she has worked with WGRA especially organizing our social events.

Sarah Quail read her Annual Report, a copy of which is attached with this Bulletin. Questions were invited from the audience and the following comments were noted:

- Minerva Heights 450 houses at Minerva Heights (Whitehouse Farm) are now inhabited.
- Speed Indicating Device The Committee will further investigate the possibility of purchasing our own permanent Speed Indicating Device on Westgate but we understand that there are problems not only with cost but also with the siting and operation of the device which is subject to Highways Department regulations. Further public liability insurance might also be necessary. Previous fundraising efforts in conjunction with Parklands have not been successful. A show of hands indicated that a number of members would be prepared to contribute to the purchase of a device.
- o **<u>The 20mph roundel markings</u>** on Westgate are due to be repainted during the current roadworks.
- <u>The Tannery Redevelopment</u> Following concerns over potential excavations and felling of trees at the site, Clare Apel, Chichester District Councillor, responded that meetings have been held with the developers and planning officers over these issues. Apparently, excavation will be necessary due to contamination of the site and a further meeting is planned to discuss protection of the trees as far as possible.
- <u>Dutch Roundabout</u> Work on the new roundabout layout planned at the eastern end of Westgate now will probably not commence until Feb or March or probably April next year. The plan of the roundabout was included with the October Bulletin. Members were reminded that the alternative to this was to have a fully signalized junction with traffic lights and little greenery. There were concerns regarding whether motorists would understand or comply with the new layout which is designed to give priority to pedestrians and cyclists in order to accommodate safer walking and cycling.

- Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) Concerns were raised regarding Chichester District 0 Council's preferred options of this plan and the resulting implications for Westgate. Julia Smith noted the LCWIP proposals attract central government funding and in order to proceed, residents were encouraged to complete a survey about whether they broadly support the idea for some kind of restrictions on traffic along Westgate and were given a few options to consider. Until the finer detail is worked out, it is too early for the committee to take a view or comment at the moment.
- **Traffic monitoring** Clare Apel said that monitoring of the levels of traffic at the Westgate / Sherborne Road 0 roundabout had been carried out at peak times in the morning and afternoon in order to have up to date figures as opposed to those given in the SAR planning application which are many years old.
