Whitehouse Farm (WHF) Phase 2: Southern Access Road (SAR) Planning Application

As mentioned in our email of 26 December 2023, Chichester District Council's (CDC) Planning Committee met on 10 January 2024. The decision was made to accept the Planning Proposals. This decision, while very disappointing, was not unexpected. However, we can assure you that the WGRA Committee will continue to try and ensure that we see less traffic on Westgate for the benefit of residents, pedestrians and cyclists.

Other traffic matters

- (i) Work still remains to be completed on repairing the pink paving in the Narrows as part of the WHF Phase 1 mitigation and also on the proposed Dutch roundabout at the east end of the Narrows. This is unlikely to begin before April.
- (ii) Further, at our last WGRA Committee meeting, we discussed the issues relating to the current lay-out at the Sherborne Road and Westgate roundabout and we thought it would be useful to have a record of road traffic incidents you may hear about or see at this junction and on the adjoining pavements. If you are able to do so, please send a brief note to our Secretary (sec.wgra@gmail.com) and between us, your officers and committee will decide whether we need to report the incidents on to either Highways or the Police.

Centurion Way Gateway Arch Update. After two years of campaigning, a nice local story is that West Sussex County Council (WSCC) have at last agreed to work with local group, the Friends of Centurion Way, to support the restoration and reinstatement of the original archway sculpture that stood by the railway bridge at Bishop Luffa to mark the start of the trail - which now extends up to Binderton with further plans to take it up to Cocking. It really is a gateway path from the City to the Downs!



Having successfully protected and opposed the diversion of the path by the Whitehouse Farm developers, the group wants to see the arch reinstated as part of the sequence of artworks along the path (originally created by local sculptor Richard Farrington and installed by WSCC and Sustrans in 1995). There is no WSCC funding available but the City Council and the developers have supported the campaign and the group are currently applying for a grant from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and other arts trusts, ahead of possible crowdfunding effort later in the year.

There was a New Years' Day event held on the path which a number of residents attended, and it is fantastic that community support (and pressure) has persuaded WSCC to change its mind and support the reinstatement with help on the planning and practicalities! I now have details about a number of the houses in the road and if you would like to find out about yours and share it with me, the window is getting shorter. I expect to do to a private print in March or April. So please let me have anything this month if you can.

It is worth going to the West Sussex Record Office in Orchard Road, just around the corner from Westgate. You will have to sign on and get an 'Archives Card', this takes about 3 minutes (you need identification) and is free. This allows access to the Search Room, which is also free (a good chance to get value from your rates!). There are always 2-3 people on duty and if you ask for help with researching your house they are very helpful and have some remarkable information.
